Did you know?

Bath is built within the hollow of the hills. There are green views in every direction from the city centre. The countryside is very close to the city centre. The landscape was used by architects who built elegant terraces and villas along the hillsides as the city expanded in the 18th century.

There are trees, woodland and grazing land across the city's 'Skyline' (<u>https://www.nationaltrust.org.uk/bath-skyline</u>) which enhance Bath's natural beauty. Within the city are parks, gardens, river views and the canal.
